Role outline

The Lead Teacher of Outreach is responsible for managing, developing, and coordinating Surrey Maths School (SuMS)'s outreach provision. They plan, deliver, and coordinate the delivery of a variety of programmes, utilising internal staff expertise. This teacher will generate enthusiasm for the mathematical sciences and inspire all students to work to their potential. They will work closely with external stakeholders to fulfil the school's outreach mission.

Responsibilities

Development and delivery of the outreach programme

- a. Lead, manage and develop the school's programme of outreach for students. The programme will be shaped by the post holder by could include:
 - i. Primary masterclasses
 - ii. GCSE enrichment lessons for Y9-11
 - iii. University preparation for Y12-13
 - iv. GCSE and/or A Level Easter revision sessions and a summer schools programme
 - v. Teacher CPD (occasionally twilight)
- b. Head the development of the resources and scheme of learning for all outreach programmes.
- c. Head the delivery of the programmes, teaching across all key stages and deploying SuMS staff as needed.
- d. Be willing to sometimes work outside of the core school hours and occasionally on Saturdays.
- e. Promoting and safeguarding the welfare of students on our outreach programmes.
- f. Build strong and lasting relationships with local schools, University of Surrey and the U-Maths network in developing an outstanding outreach programme to benefit the local community.
- g. Oversee and manage the marketing and application process for all programmes to ensure outstanding levels of participation particularly from underrepresented groups (including liaising with the administration team to manage the website and advertising of programmes).
- h. Actively promote equity and diversity through the planning and delivery of inclusive lessons, in line with the school's values.

Coordination and evaluation of the outreach programme

- a. Manage the logistical arrangements for planning and delivery of the outreach programmes.
- b. Maintain electronic records of attendees across all programmes.
- c. Manage the SuMS Outreach inbox.
- d. Provide content and updates for the SuMS website relating to outreach activities and opportunities.
- e. Develop strategies to evaluate the effectiveness of each of the programmes with respect to the school's outreach mission, and refine for future years by collecting and studying appropriate data.
- f. Be accountable for the delivery and quality of the outreach programmes and work closely with the Headteacher(s) to quality assure the programmes.
- g. Liaise with the Headteacher(s) in implementing the outreach strategy and on staffing matters.

Other

- a. Take on any additional reasonable responsibilities as directed by the Headteacher(s).
- b. Be a proactive and positive member of the school community.
- c. Contribute to whole school activities and the smooth running of the school such as by undertaking the role of tutor and delivering PSHEE, providing cover for absent colleagues, undertaking duties and invigilation support as needed.
